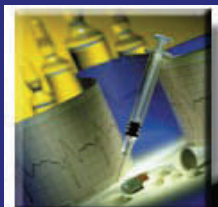

Occupational Health Program

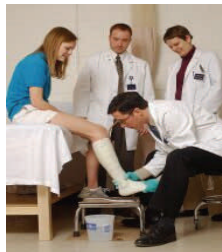
An Occupational Health Program has been launched for Georgia Tech employees, including students, who may be exposed to health risks as part of their jobs. The Environmental Health Safety (EHS) Office, will conduct risk assessments within departments to identify potentially hazardous exposures and to determine which job functions should be included in the Occupational Health program. Informational packets will be distributed to researchers, staff, and eligible students. All affected employees will be contacted by EHS. Medical monitoring, testing services, and vaccinations will be provided at no cost to employees, under a contract with Concentra Health Services. Concentra is located just across Interstate 75/85 at 688 Spring Street.



Who is eligible to participate?

Any employee, including students, who, based on job function and risk assessment, may be exposed to occupational health risks, may participate in the Occupational Health Program. The focus of the program will be on occupations involving the handling of animals and those who handle biological materials, chemicals or are exposed to other workplace hazards.



Is participation mandatory?

Medical monitoring is not mandatory, but all persons identified by EHS whose work responsibilities and environment may subject them to occupational illness or injury are required to be enrolled in the Georgia Tech Occupational Health Program. All persons in such positions are required to complete the forms and attend a training session prior to being able to waive or opt out of the medical monitoring component of the program.

What training is available?

An overview of available training programs will be announced on the EHS website at www.ehs.gatech.edu. EHS staff will also be available to meet with departments or individuals to answer questions and conduct training for laboratory groups.

How do employees enroll?

Complete the *Confidential Exposure/Risk Assessment Questionnaire* form online at the EHS website. Employees who opt out of the medical monitoring component, or portions thereof, must submit a signed waiver form to EHS. Forms are available on the EHS website at www.ehs.gatech.edu.

What is done with employee's private health information?

A personalized risk assessment is conducted by EHS occupational health staff to determine the appropriate course of action for employee medical monitoring. All employee health records are confidentially handled by Concentra physicians in accordance with federal regulations.



Who pays for the medical screening, testing, and vaccinations?

Occupational Health Program costs are covered by EHS and are handled on a direct-bill basis by Concentra Health Services. No out of pocket expenses will be required of Georgia Tech employees.
